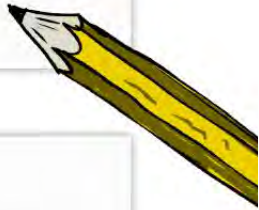

UNDER THE LENS

Tanto en inglés como en español, existen dos maneras de hablar sobre el origen o la nacionalidad de una persona o un animal:

- Nombrando el país → “The ovenbird is **from Argentina**.”
→ “El hornero es **de Argentina**”.
- Nombrando la nacionalidad → “The ovenbird is an **Argentine** bird.”
→ “El hornero es un ave **argentina**”.

Además, en inglés, para hablar de nuestra nacionalidad podemos usar tres formas distintas: *Argentine*, *Argentinian* o *Argentinean*.

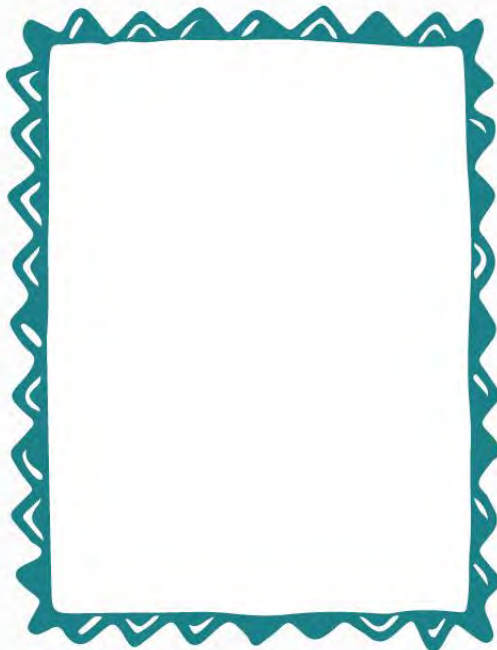
